

Auction of Spectrum for CDMA2000 Third Batch of Questions and Answers

The Telecommunications Authority (the "Authority") has received the following further question in relation to the Information Memorandum. As mentioned in Section F.2.1 of the Information Memorandum, the Authority now sets out his responses to the question.

Terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the same meaning ascribed thereto in the Notice issued by the Authority on 31 August 2007 (the "Notice"), or as the case may be, in Appendix D "Glossary of Terms" of the Information Memorandum.

Q.40 Will the Authority announce who the applicants are ?

A.40 If, after the Application Stage and the Pre-qualification Stage, there is only one Qualified Bidder, the Auction will not take place and the Authority will issue a press release as soon as possible announcing the result, including the identity of the Provisional Successful Bidder.

If there are two or more Qualified Bidders, the Authority will not issue any press release prior to the completion of the Auction. Rather, the Authority will publish as soon as possible and in any case within 2 Business Days after the completion of the Auction an Auction Result Notice announcing the following:

- a) the identities of all the Qualified Bidders who have participated in the Auction Stage;
- b) the identity of the Provisional Successful Bidder;
- c) the amount of SUF applicable to the use of the Frequencies;
- d) any other information as determined by the Authority.

Please refer to paragraphs 3.3.1 and 4.14.1 of the Notice.
